Project Overview: The Rhode Island Department of Housing (Department) provided grants to municipalities that were accommodating new overnight shelters or existing shelters that have had their capacity expanded since May 1, 2023. Grant proceeds were required to directly or indirectly benefit individuals and/or families served by the new or expanded overnight shelters. Potential services included, but are not limited to:

- Emergency medical services and/or security.
- Waste management and/or sanitation services.
- Transportation for individuals staying at the shelter.
- Day programs, professional development, education services.
- Behavioral health services and substance use disorder services.
- Public facility improvements near the shelter.
- Meal programs.
- Housing resource counseling.
- Outreach services.
- Community and business outreach.
- Emergency warming/cooling center costs.

There were three types of awards:

Formula Grants: Municipalities where new overnight shelters opened and/or existing shelters expanded as of May 1, 2023, and remained in service until at least April 15, 2024, were eligible to receive \$2,000 per new shelter bed.

Regional Emergency Hub/Competitive Grants: The Department provided competitive grants for emergency regional hubs during severe winter weather conditions.

Competitive Grants: The Department assisted municipalities with additional costs that were not covered by the formula grants. These competitive grants ensured the success and longevity of shelter projects through municipal services, staffing, transportation, infrastructure, or programs that exceeded the formula grants

Seventeen grants were awarded to nine cities/towns through three separate requests for proposals. Funds distributed in Rounds 1 and 2 included all three different types of awards. In Round 3, only Regional Emergency/Hub Competitive Grants were awarded. The following awards were made:

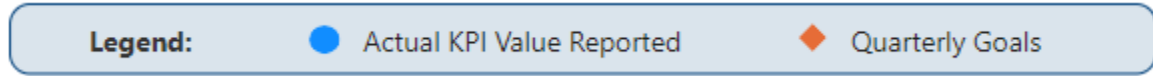

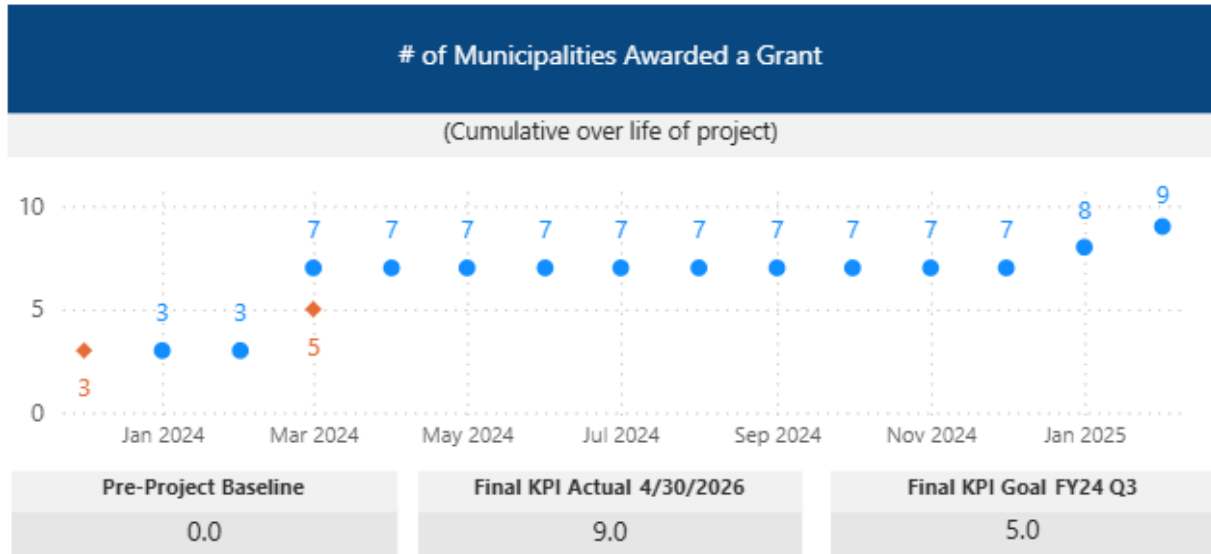
Financial Overview: All program payments can be found on the [Pandemic Recovery Office's website](#) by filtering the "Project" box for "Municipal Homelessness Support Initiative." The project did not utilize its full appropriation of \$2.2 million, with \$200,429 in unexpended funds remaining at the conclusion of the project. These funds were reclassified to the Department of Administration's eligible *ERP Implementation Support* project. 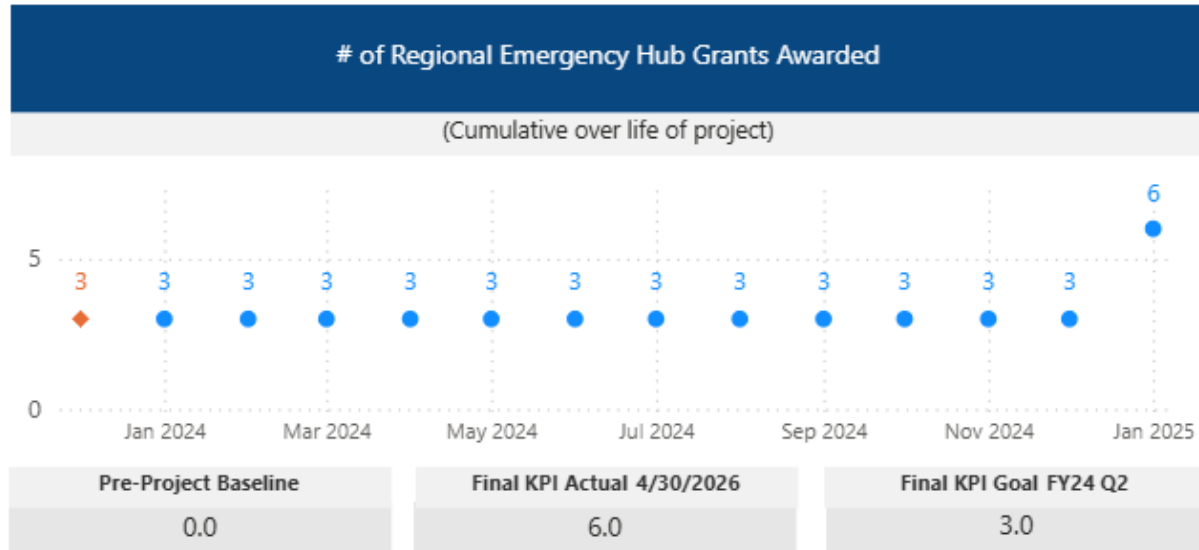

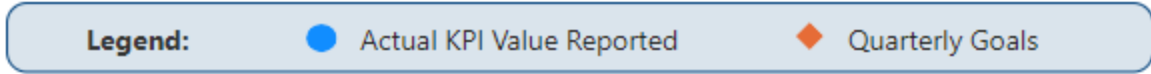


1. Number of municipalities awarded a grant

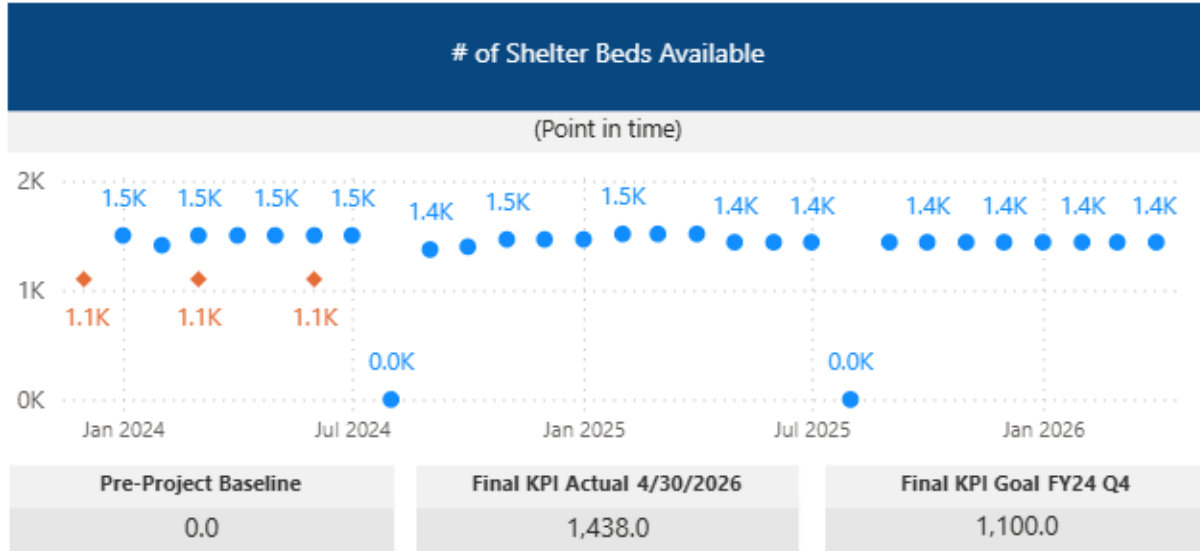


2. Number of regional emergency hub grants awarded

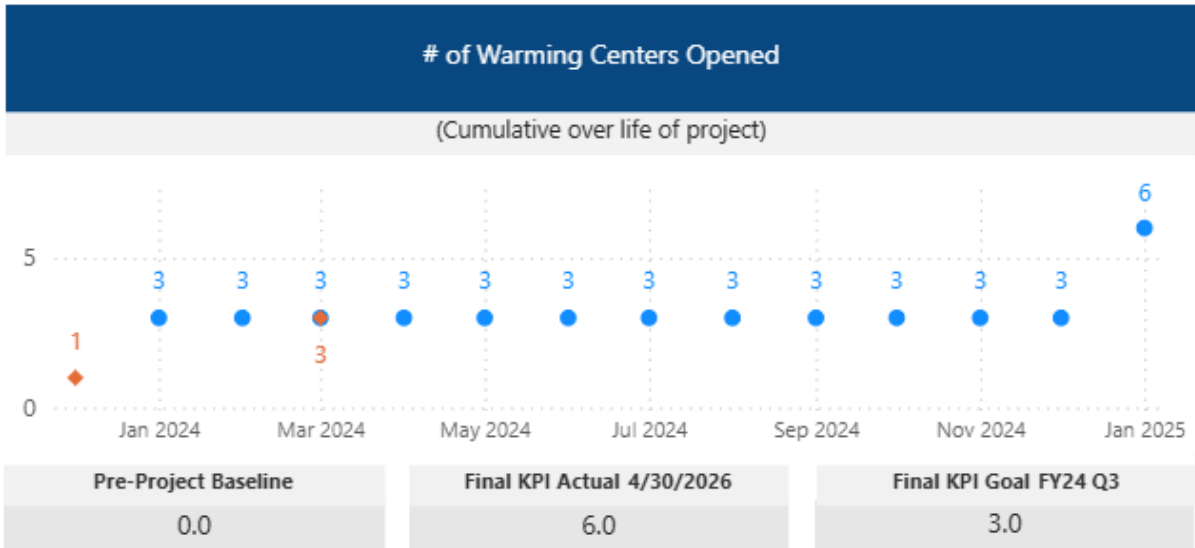




3. Number of shelter beds available
