Nationally, the child day care services industry had an average employment loss of 9.8% from early 2020 compared to fall of 2021. Additionally, 78% of respondents to a nationwide National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) survey identified low wages as the main obstacle to recruiting educators, while 81% said they are a key reason that educators leave.
